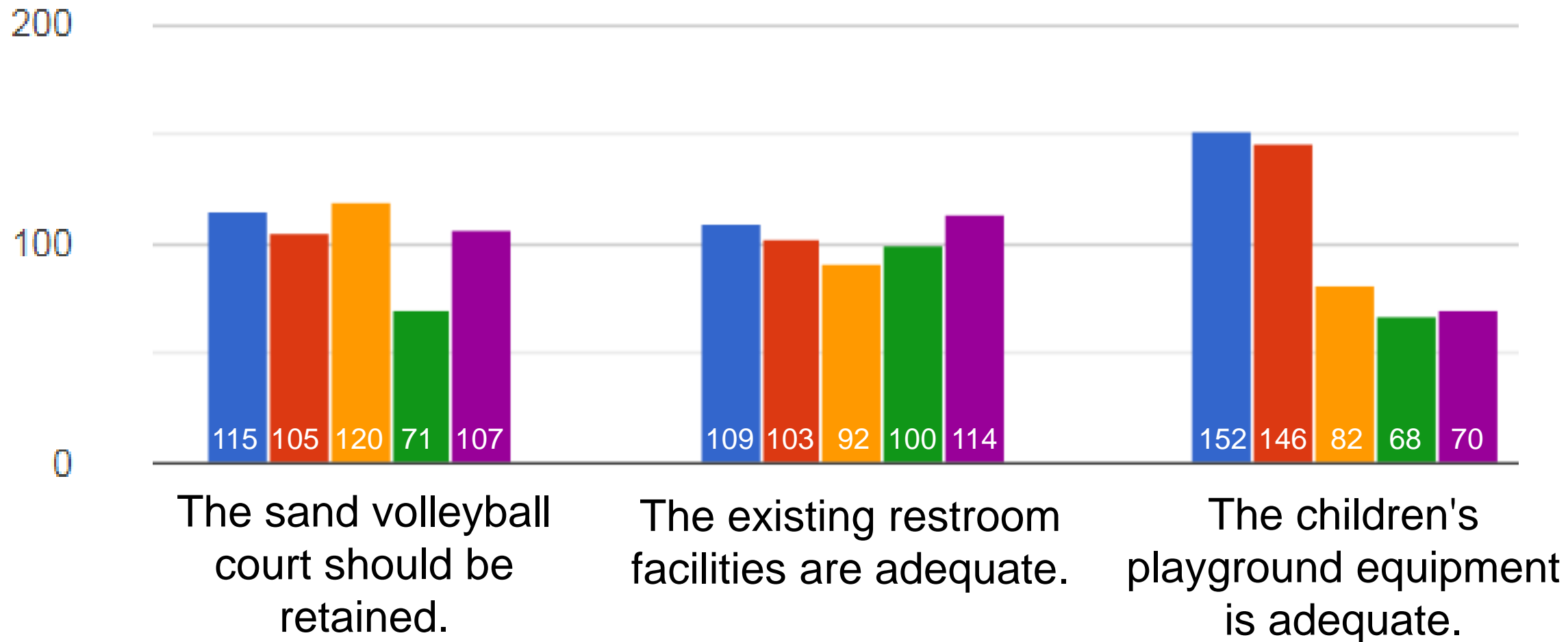

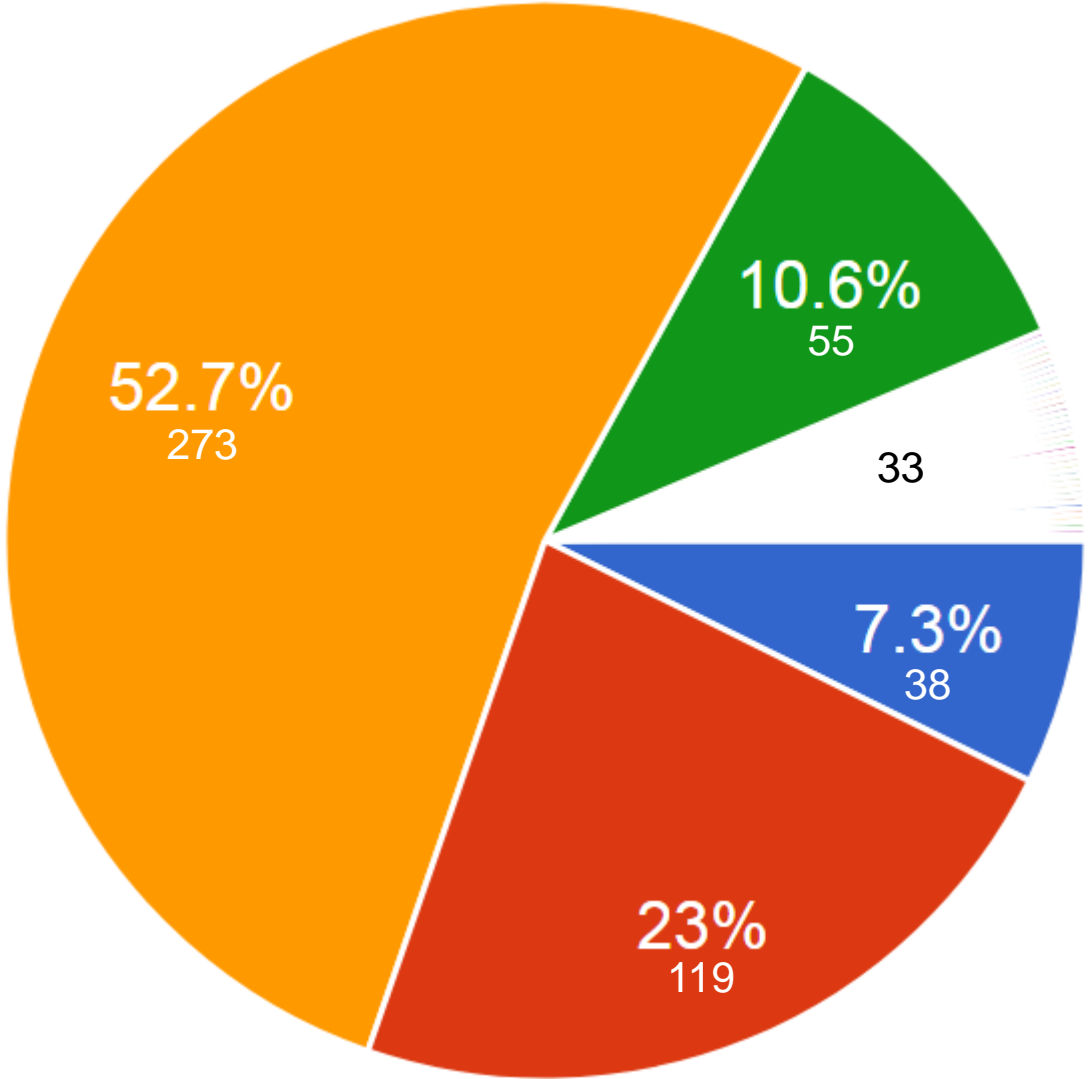

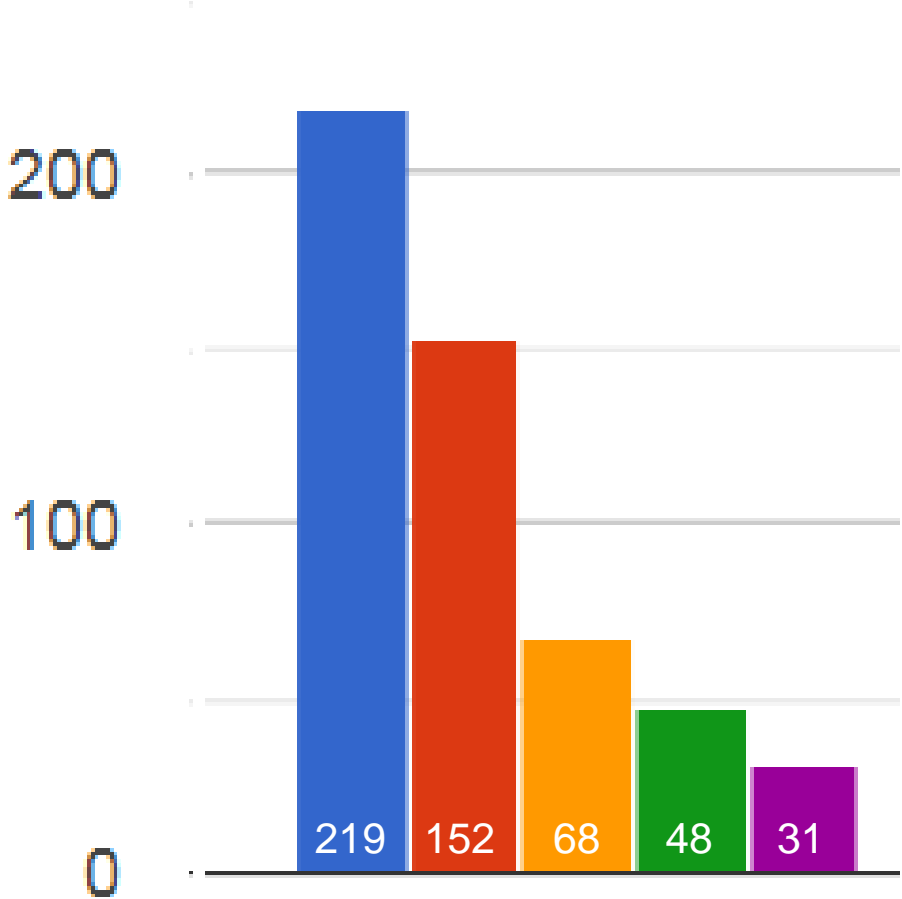
Given California's periodic water shortages, I think landscaping choices should be made with drought tolerance in mind.

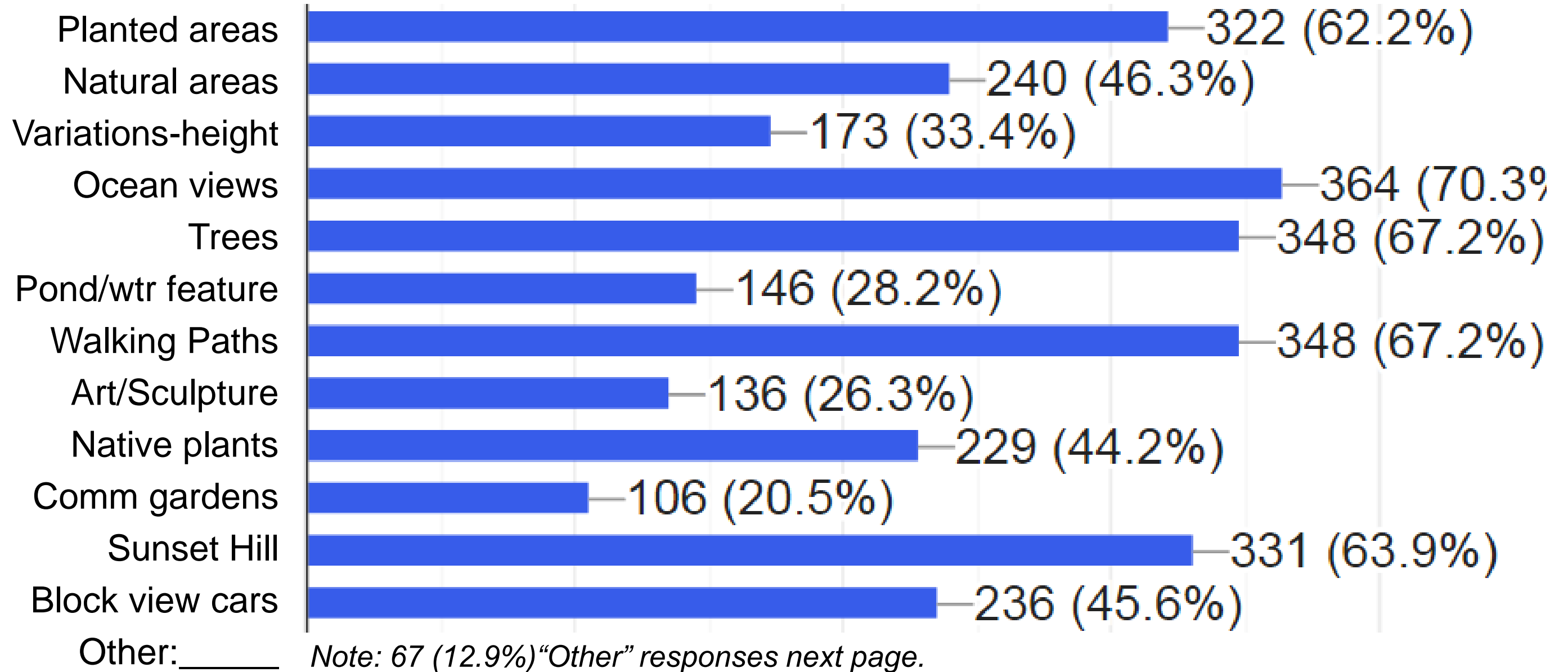

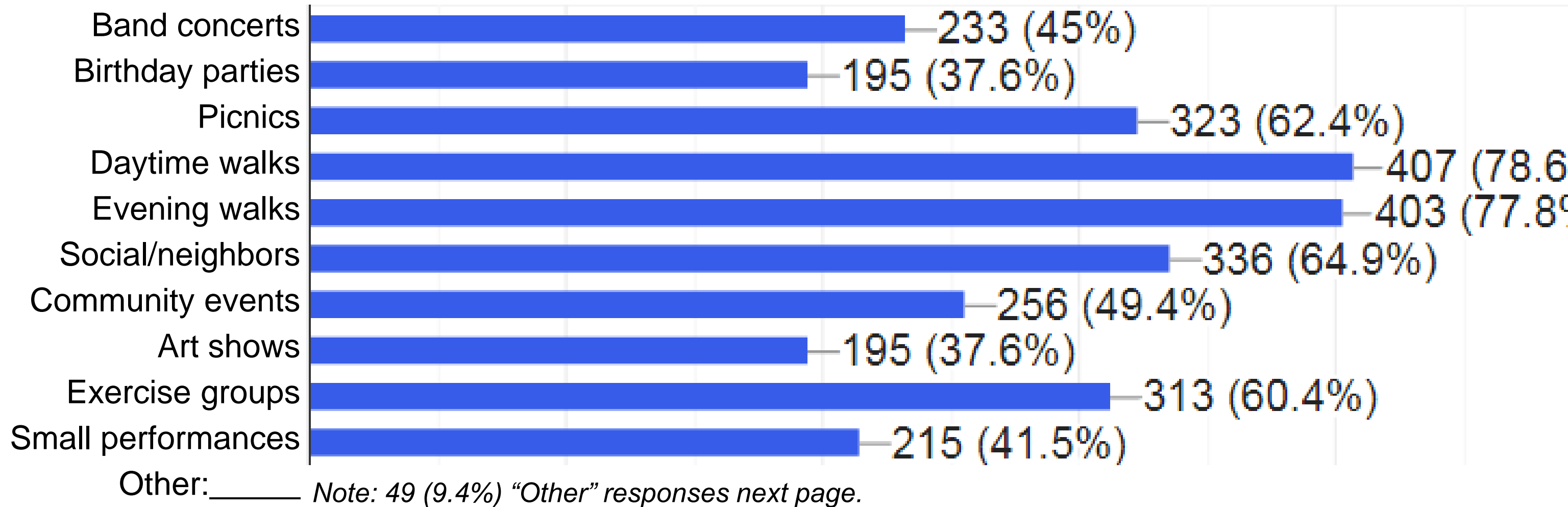
- a designated dog park that is fenced off and not by the street

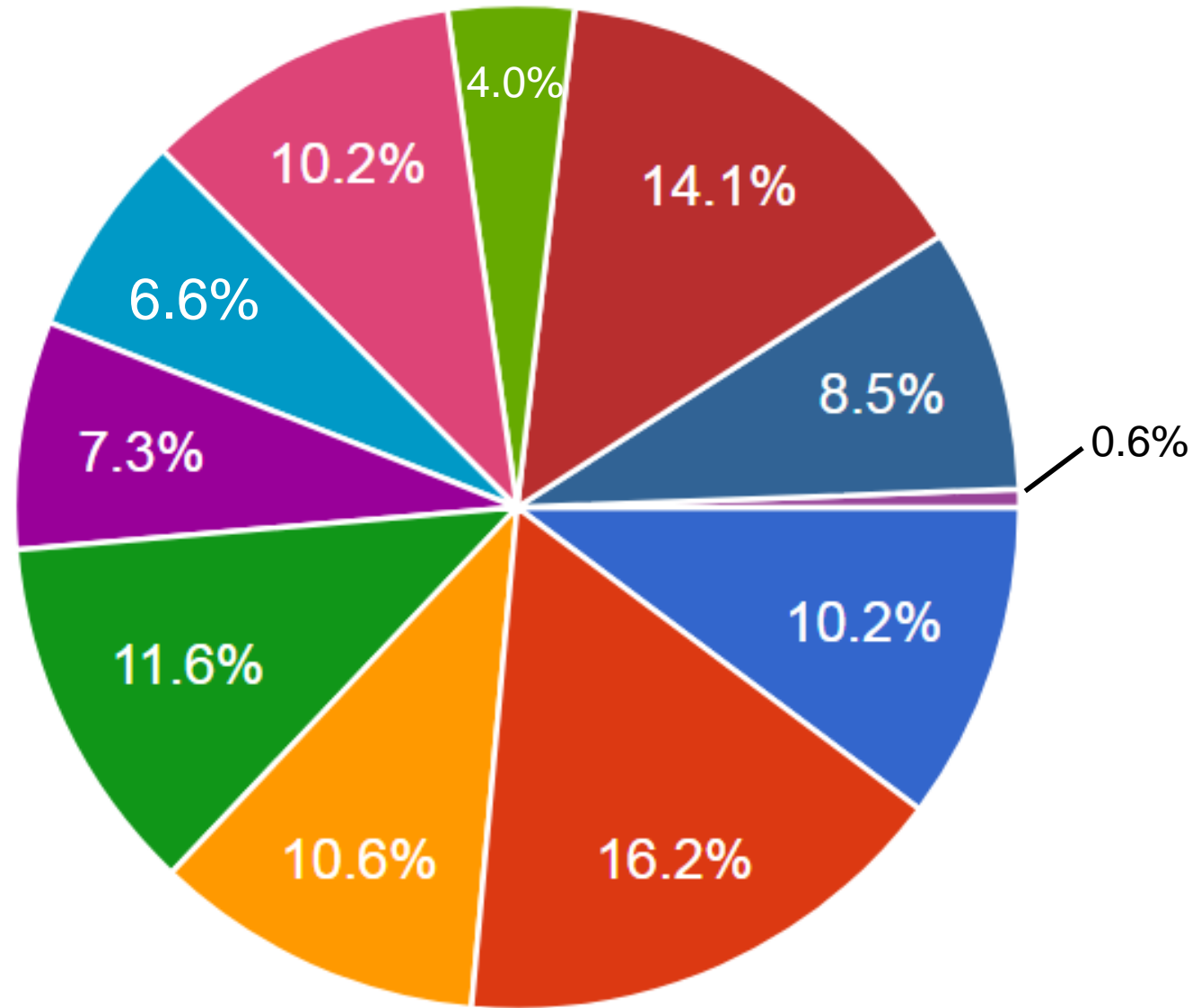
